



California Multi-Sector Workforce Partnership

The partnership was formed to address **123 individual mass dislocations** affecting **32,527 workers** in a range of occupations in **19 California industries** with **5,887** of the total expected to participate.

The general purpose of this partnership project is **to provide a collaborative response to the retraining and career transition needs of economically dislocated workers and the talent location and development needs of employers in economically vital sectors.**

Project Administration

Role of the South Bay WIB, Inc.:

- Serve as grant recipient, fiscal agent, and administrative entity for the Multi-Sector Partnership
- Collaborate with state-level partners, regional SPOCs, and CWA to manage successful project implementation.
- Duties will include leadership and administration of all NEG-funded activities of the Multi-Sector Partnership.

Role of the California Workforce Association

- Serve as information clearinghouse on local project results, and new federal, state and local initiatives in workforce and economic development.
- Facilitate monthly partnership meetings.

Role of the California Workforce Association

- Gather and disseminate information on promising practices with emphasis how such practices can be conducted as part of the NEG program.
- Coordinate with EDD, the Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges, CDE, and other state agencies to assist in leveraging resources to support the partnership's activities.

California Multi-Sector Workforce Partnership

- Funding will be awarded in increments based on performance and demonstrated need for additional financial assistance.
- First Increment: \$18,030,129 (40%)
- Project Administration = 1.5% of grant
