

## **Law School Admission Council Loses Bid to Narrow DFEH's Discrimination Class Action, Daily Journal Reports**

The January 30, 2013, Daily Journal reported that in *Department of Fair Employment and Housing v. Law School Admissions Council Inc.*, 12-1830 (N.D. Cal., filed April 12, 2012), U.S. District Court Judge Edward Chen rejected a motion by attorneys for LSAC that aimed to prohibit federal prosecutors from piggybacking with separate claims from outside California.

The Daily Journal reported that in a hearing on the motion Tuesday afternoon, Judge Chen asked, ““Is the tail wagging the dog here? . . . It may be true that once the anchor is set, you can have a few more attachments to that, but in this case the anchor is outweighed by the new boat.”” The Daily Journal reported that “LSAC, based in Pennsylvania, is simultaneously fighting to defend its practices. The company filed a lawsuit against the state of California earlier this month over a new law that makes it illegal to notify law schools that an applicant received extra time.”

A March 28, 2013 hearing on the DFEH's motion to amend the complaint and certify the class is next.
