NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Fair Political Practices Commission, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Sections 82011, 87303, and 87304 of the Government Code to review proposed conflict-of-interest codes, will review the proposed/amended conflict-of-interest codes of the following:

CONFLICT-OF-INTEREST CODES

AMENDMENT

MULTI-COUNTY: Sonoma County Junior College District

A written comment period has been established commencing on **January 13, 2012**, and closing on **February 27, 2012**. Written comments should be directed to the Fair Political Practices Commission, Attention **Cynthia Fisher**, 428 J Street, Suite 620, Sacramento, California 95814.

At the end of the 45-day comment period, the proposed conflict-of-interest code(s) will be submitted to the Commission's Executive Director for his review, unless any interested person or his or her duly authorized representative requests, no later than 15 days prior to the close of the written comment period, a public hearing before the full Commission. If a public hearing is requested, the proposed code(s) will be submitted to the Commission for review.

The Executive Director of the Commission will review the above-referenced conflict-of-interest code(s), proposed pursuant to Government Code Section 87300, which designate, pursuant to Government Code Section 87302, employees who must disclose certain investments, interests in real property and income.

The Executive Director of the Commission, upon his or its own motion or at the request of any interested person, will approve, or revise and approve, or return the proposed code(s) to the agency for revision and re-submission within 60 days without further notice.

Any interested person may present statements, arguments or comments, in writing to the Executive Direc-

tor of the Commission, relative to review of the proposed conflict-of-interest code(s). Any written comments must be received no later than **February 27, 2012**. If a public hearing is to be held, oral comments may be presented to the Commission at the hearing.

COST TO LOCAL AGENCIES

There shall be no reimbursement for any new or increased costs to local government which may result from compliance with these codes because these are not new programs mandated on local agencies by the codes since the requirements described herein were mandated by the Political Reform Act of 1974. Therefore, they are not "costs mandated by the state" as defined in Government Code Section 17514.

EFFECT ON HOUSING COSTS AND BUSINESSES

Compliance with the codes has no potential effect on housing costs or on private persons, businesses or small businesses.

AUTHORITY

Government Code Sections 82011, 87303 and 87304 provide that the Fair Political Practices Commission as the code reviewing body for the above conflict-of-interest codes shall approve codes as submitted, revise the proposed code(s) and approve it as revised, or return the proposed code(s) for revision and re-submission.

At the end of the written comment period, the proposed conflict-of-interest code will be submitted to the Commission's Executive Director for his review, unless any interested person or his or her duly authorized representative requests, no later than 15 days prior to the close of the written comment period, a public hearing before the full Commission. If a public hearing is requested, the proposed code will be submitted to the Commission for consideration at a public hearing on or after **March 15, 2012**, at the offices of the Fair Political Practices Commission, 428 J Street, Suite 800, Sacramento, California, commencing at approximately **10:00 a.m.**

In the event that no public hearing is requested, the Executive Director of the Commission will review the proposed conflict-of-interest code required under Government Code Sections 87300 and 87302, which require every agency to adopt and promulgate a conflict-of-interest code designating employees who must disclose certain investments, interests in real property and income. The Executive Director, upon his own motion or at the request of any interested person, will approve, or revise and approve, or return the proposed code(s) to the agency for revision and resubmission within 60 days without further notice.

Any interested person may present statements, arguments or comments, in writing to the Executive Director relative to review of the proposed conflict-of-interest code. If a public hearing is held, oral comments may be presented to the Commission at the hearing.

COST TO LOCAL AGENCIES

There shall be no reimbursement for any new or increased costs to local government that may result from compliance with the proposed conflict-of-interest

code because any new or increased costs do not result from a new program mandated on local agencies but from the requirements of the Political Reform Act of 1974. Therefore, any new or increased costs are not "costs mandated by the state" as defined in Government Code Section 17514.

EFFECT ON HOUSING COSTS AND BUSINESSES

Compliance with the codes has no potential effect on housing costs or on private persons, businesses or small businesses.

AUTHORITY

Government Code Section 87304 provides that the Fair Political Practices Commission may adopt a conflict-of-interest code on behalf of any agency that has failed to adopt a code as required under Government Code Section 87300 after consulting the agency. Moreover, the Commission has not received any response from the District despite multiple attempts to consult the District regarding its failure to adopt a code.

CESA CONSISTENCY DETERMINATION REQUEST FOR

Helena Nelson Terminal Project
(2080-2011-025-02)
Butte County

The Department of Fish and Game (Department) received a notice on December 20, 2011 that Foothill Associates proposes to rely on a consultation between federal agencies to carry out a project that may adversely affect a species protected by the California Endangered Species Act (CESA). The proposed action in-

volves construction of a regional agricultural fertilizer supply receiving and distribution center in Nelson, Butte County, California.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) issued a "no jeopardy" federal biological opinion (File No. 81420-2011-F-0846-1)(BO) and incidental take statement (ITS) to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers on November 21, 2011 which considered the effects of the project on the State and Federally threatened giant garter snake (*Thamnophis gigas*).

Pursuant to California Fish and Game Code Section 2080.1, Foothill Associates is requesting a determination that the BO and ITS are consistent with CESA for purposes of the proposed Project. If the Department determines the BO and ITS are consistent with CESA for the proposed Project, Foothill Associates will not be required to obtain an incidental take permit under Fish and Game Code section 2081 for the Project.

The Department of Fish and Game (Department) received a notice on December 27, 2011, that the County of Sacramento proposes to rely on a consultation between federal agencies to carry out a project that may adversely affect a species protected by the California Endangered Species Act (CESA). The proposed action involves elevating Elverta Road to pass over SR 99 on a new overcrossing structure, and widening Elverta Road to four lanes in the Natomas Basin, Sacramento County, California.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) issued a "no jeopardy" federal biological opinion (File No. 81420-2009-F-0796-3)(BO) and incidental take statement (ITS) to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers on August 11, 2011 which considered the effects of the project on the State and Federally threatened giant garter snake (*Thamnophis gigas*).

Pursuant to California Fish and Game Code Section 2080.1, the County of Sacramento is requesting a determination that the BO and ITS are consistent with CESA for purposes of the proposed Project. If the Department determines the BO and ITS are consistent with CESA for the proposed Project, the County of Sacramento will not be required to obtain an incidental take permit under Fish and Game Code section 2081 for the Project.

NO SIGNIFICANT RISK: CHLOROTHALONIL
January 13, 2012**

The Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) is providing notice of a change to a proposed regulation establishing a No Significant Risk Level (NSRL) for chlorothalonil in Title 27, California Code of Regulations, section 25705.^{1, 2} This proposed regulatory action is being taken pursuant to OEHHA's authority under Proposition 65.³

The proposed NSRL published on March 18, 2011,⁴ for chlorothalonil has been changed to **41 micrograms per day**. The changes are shown in double-underline and double-strike-out. The change has been made because OEHHA used a more current calculation to convert estimates of animal cancer potency to estimates of human cancer potency.⁵ This proposed regulation was originally the subject of a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, published on March 18, 2011. Responses to written comments from the current and prior comment periods will be provided in the final statement of reasons for this rulemaking.

A copy of the text of the amended proposed regulation and a modified technical support document presenting the updated calculations⁶ used to convert estimates of animal cancer potency to estimates of human cancer potency are available on the OEHHA website at www.oehha.ca.gov. Implement Regulations Needed by the Enactment of AB 2496

The Department of Justice (Department) submitted this emergency readoption action to continue the emergency regulations adopted in OAL File Nos. 2011-0330-02E and 2011-0927-01EE. The emergency regulations were adopted to enhance title 11 procedures and requirements that govern the sale and distribution of cigarettes and roll-your-own tobacco products. The existing regulations were adopted to assure compliance with state financial responsibility laws pertaining to tobacco product manufacturers. Revenue and Taxation Code section 30165.1 requires that all tobacco product manufacturers and brand families be listed on a directory maintained by the Department on its web site in order to conduct business in California. The emergency action implemented recent enhancements to the Department's authority and jurisdiction over tobacco manufacturers and importers enacted in AB 2496 (Stats. 2010, ch. 265).

The emergency regulations provide additional requirements, documentation, and forms that are required under AB 2496 for tobacco manufacturers to demonstrate compliance with the laws governing the sale and distribution of the specified tobacco-related products and to maintain listing on the Department's website. This action makes substantial revisions to three of eleven incorporated forms, updates the revision date of those forms in the regulations, and makes numerous other nonsubstantive revisions to the regulation text and to some of the authority and reference citations. The Department submitted a written request for a later effective date of 1/5/2012 per Gov. Code 11343.4(b).

vides that diversions of water from the Russian River stream system, including the pumping of groundwater which is hydraulically connected to the stream system, for the purposes of frost protection between March 15 and May 15, must be done in accordance with a State Water Resources Control Board approved Water Demand Management Program (WDMP). The regulation specifies the contents of a WDMP, as well as the circumstances under which groundwater diverters may be exempted from the application of the regulation. The regulation also establishes that compliance with the regulation shall constitute a condition of all water permits and licenses that authorize the diversion of water from this stream system for frost protection.
