**Goal 2: Housing**

**People with I/DD have access to affordable and accessible housing that provides control, choice and flexibility regarding where and with whom they live.**

**Goal 3: Health**

3. Durable equipment (e.g. assistive language devices, wheelchairs, etc.)
4. Preventative/Mental/Dental Health (Recreation crossover)
5. Disparity (language/cultural)
